

MAY DEMONSTRATION by RON COMPTOIS: Turning a Baby Rattle







Our Demo for the month was done by Ron Comtois. He showed us how he makes a baby rattle. He uses popcorn inside the rattle. Turned out of two pieces of the wood, the rattle portion is hollowed out leaving a tendon for remounting on the lathe. He turned a handle, then put the popcorn in before glueing with Thick and Quick Titebond (because it dries clear). Normally, he lets it dry overnight. For the finish, he usually uses CA glue because of its hardness. It stands up to baby teeth and pounding. Size is critical for the safety of the baby. Ron makes them a bit smaller because young babies (3-6 months) can handle them and not reek havoc on furniture. Standard recommended size is 2 inches in diameter. Go to the chapter website: SMWTS.org to see Ron's step-by-step & illustrated **handout**. Il will surely help you turn a baby rattle yourself for the Quarterly Challenge.
