Safety Talk - Gordon Fowler

In this month's talk, Gordon reminded us that if you get a cut while turning, treat it! Cleansing, an antibiotic ointment, and bandage can prevent infection or worse, surgery.

He also referred to a mistake he made while demonstrating his platter from crotch wood. Be careful with the grain direction for strength of the piece, and remember that a cone live center can puncture a piece of wood.

DEMO: COLIN CHALMERS AN EXCEPTIONAL PLATTER










Colin's demonstrated his approach to making a 15" platter from silver maple and how to insert leather cord inlays as decoration.

Colin grinds his bowl gouges free hand with a 40/40 grind. He told us negative scrapers don't work well on silver maple, so he uses a shear cut instead. He did some sanding because it cannot be done after inserting the leather cording. He slap recommended using an inertia sander (doesn't need a drill).

Handy glue bottles with small replaceable tips are available at Woodcraft. The leather cords—2 sizes with the larger one braided —are available at Hobby Lobby.
