Michael turned a Calabash bowl with a lid and shared history of the bowl originating from the Hawaiian Islands. Michael kept a running dialogue going the entire time he was making chips fly. The finished product was a small Calabash Bowl with a lid, or was it a small Calabash box with a lid? When does a bowl with a lid become a box with a lid? Nevertheless, it was a great demo to round out a great meeting.

Not only did Michael show us how to turn a Calabash bowl, but he talked about how to achieve fine cuts, to use specific tools, and told us about the history of Calabash bowls in Hawaii and how they repaired cracks with Pewa (butterfly) repairs. Michael has given us details on his Covered Calabash bowl and the Pewa (butterfly) Repair Process.







For final cuts on the inside bottom, he used a straight "hook" tool made by Wiedemann & passed around the bent tool. https://www.dictum.comen/search?search=widemann — "Not cheap, but very high quality."



About Mark —information from his website

Mark is from Cincinnati, Ohio and learned woodworking as a teenager from his father. In 1996, after a 2-week turning class at Arrowmont, he was "hooked on the turning process. Since 2000, he and his family have lived in Saluda, NC, where he has his studio. Mark teaches and demonstrates woodturning around the country. He calls himself a production turner—primarily of bowls—but the embellishment techniques for his products is exceptional. Frequently, his designs combine hand-drawn patterns combined with wood burning or engraving and layers of one or more colors of milk paint along with sanding some paint away showing paint in the design cuts. We thank Mark for a wonderful and productive weekend learning experience. He's a thoroughly nice guy, too.

Winged Bowl, maple









Shrink Box, cherry with bottom insert of maple
